


Figure 2. 1952 aerial image of 277 Moreland Avenue SE. Property roughly marked.




Figure 3. 1960 aerial image of 277 Moreland Avenue SE. Property roughly marked.




Figure 4. 1965 updated from 1932 Sanborn Fire Insurance Map. Property roughly marked.





Figure 6. 1981 aerial image of 277 Moreland Avenue SE. Property roughly marked.






Figure 12. Mark Inn brochure, picturing the Mark Inn East, c.1960s.




Figure 15. Mark Inn brochure, verso, c.1970s.




Figure 16. Site Plan. Original plans for the Mark Inn East, by James A. Shugart, Jr.




Figure 17. 1st Floor plan (main floor opening onto parking lot). Original plans for the Mark Inn East, by James A. Shugart, Jr.




Figure 18. 2nd floor (top floor) plan. Original plans for the Mark Inn East, by James A. Shugart, Jr.




Figure 19. Lower Level Plan. Original plans for the Mark Inn East, by James A. Shugart, Jr.




Figure 20. Elevation drawings. Original plans for the Mark Inn East, by James A. Shugart, Jr.
